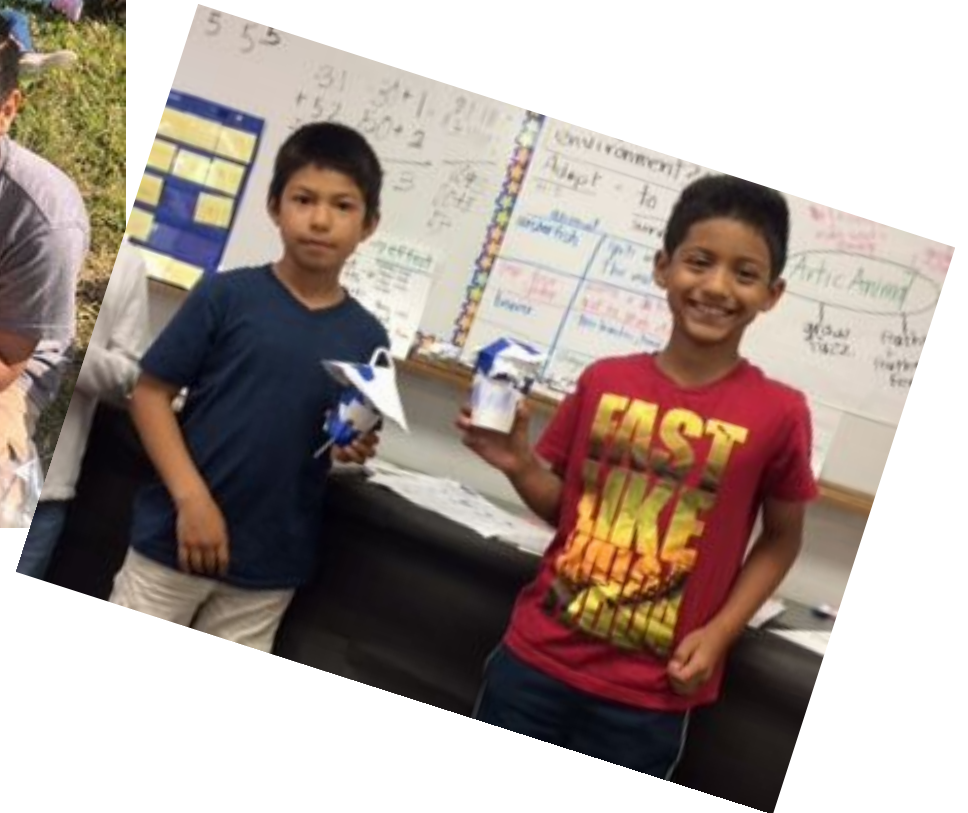

- ▶ Provided opportunities for high school students to get on course to graduate

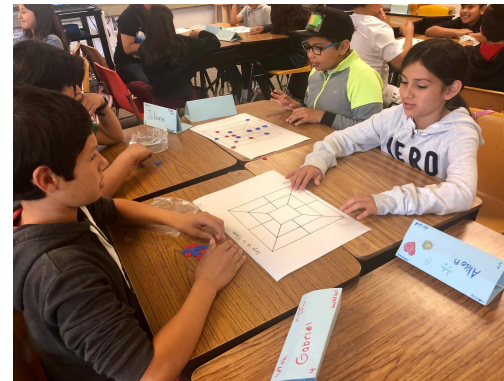
- ▶ Total enrollment = 1732 students

James Monroe Elementary

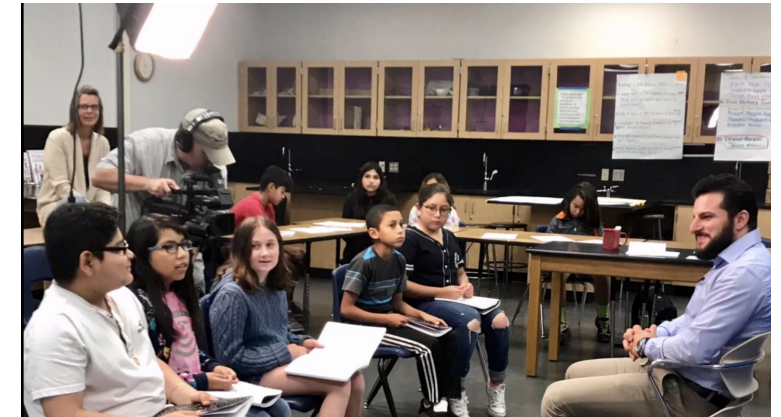
- ▶ Served 216 students Kinder Academy - 5th grade

- ▶ Bi-national teacher



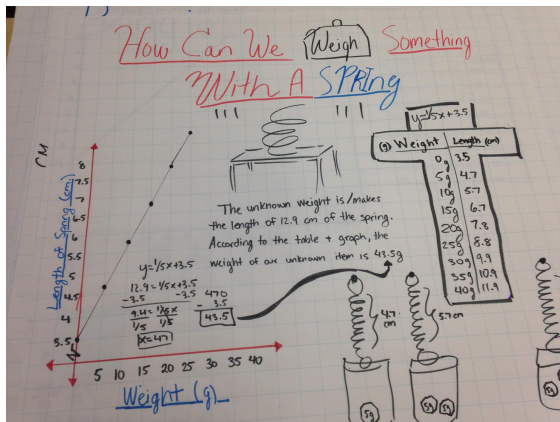
Project Maker Camp

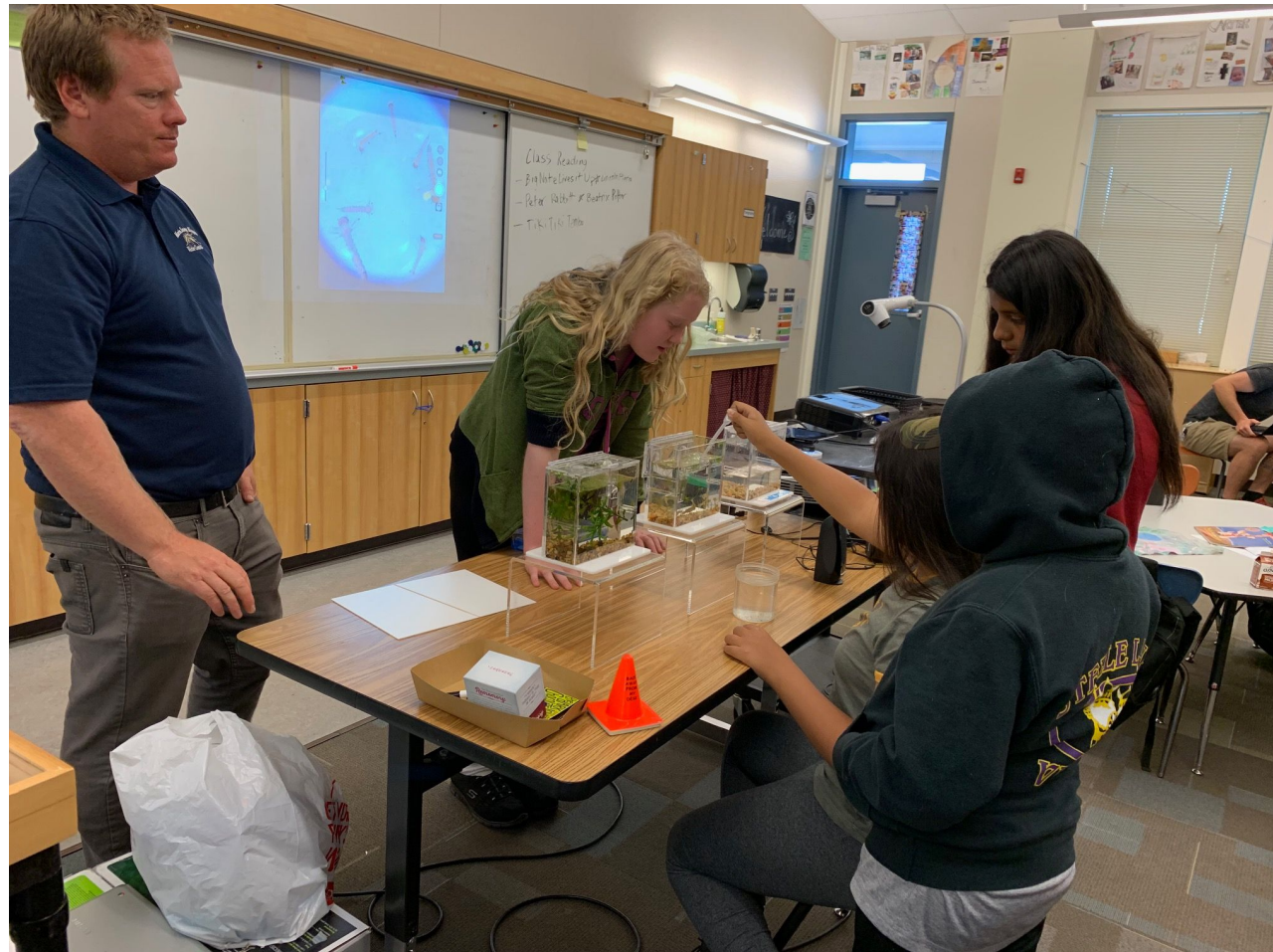
Mariachi, Art and Dance Camp

- 171 students from the City of Santa Rosa participated
- 76 SRCs students, representing 22 schools attended the camp
- 15 high school students received 5 credits for completing the program



Extended School Year

- Extended School Year (ESY) serves students with Individualized Education Plans (IEPs)
- 238 students, Pre-Kindergarten through Transition (age 22)



High School Summer Program

Elsie Allen High School

- Traditional Teacher Led Courses
 - Session 1- 615 students
 - Session 2- 342 students
- Online Credit Recovery
 - 995 total credits earned
 - 177 courses completed online
 - 30 students graduated via online credits



Next Steps Summer 2020

- ▶ Utilize AVID summer enrichment program for 6th to 7th grade and 8th to 9th grade in math and ELA
- ▶ Continue to expand enrichment opportunities for all students
 - ▶ Explore funding sources to partner with SSU's EXCEL for Youth
