The Strategic Plan

Instruction

- Implement Writing with Design professional development in an additional 12 classrooms
 - RHMS will have 20 ELA, Social Studies, Resource, and English Language Devel. (ELD) teachers fully trained by the conclusion of 2019-2020
- Pilot Math Workshop 7 and 8
 - Students strategically selected, looking at SBAC, grades, and iReady for a trimester of math support
- Pilot FLEX time in grade 6 for both ELA and Math
 - For two weeks a month, students will be flexibly grouped in ELA and Math during non Phys. Ed. time

The Strategic Plan

Climate

- In order to increase opportunities for students to empathize with and support peers...
 - Continue Adaptive Phys. Ed. elective serving 75 Gen. Ed. students and their 15 students with disabilities peers
 - Transition student “teacher aides” to “peer tutors”
 - Move Leadership class to a year-long offering and team with our students with special needs
 - Schoolwide Expectations has become Caring, Responsible, Safe
 - Increase opportunities for students to be leaders
 - Re-vamp morning announcements

The Strategic Plan

Parent Engagement

- Goal: Increase communication with families so there is a greater sense of belonging and awareness.
 - Two parent information sessions guided our focus
 - June: 63 families
 - August: 191 families
- Back to School Night had 741 students represented
- Seesaw App (as of 10/01/19)
 - 755 parent/guardian sign-ups
 - 3416 student posts
 - 2589 parent visits and responses
- Conferencing to allow parents to meet with all teachers as needed.






My girl is looking forward to have an amazing year at RHMS, to make new friends, develop her social skills, and perform well academically!

Share Vulnerability

- We recognize our year-to-year SBAC data in sixth grade showed a significant decline.
- We received feedback from families about the need for more streamlined communication.
- We want to move to an environment where peer walkthroughs are positive and collaborative, not critical.
- We struggle to keep up the pace of frequent and quality classroom visits.
- We want to address the best manner in which to ease staff stressors.

Celebrations

- Writing with Design at every level and for every child
- 19% of our ELD student exited
- We have the courage and scheduling flexibility to pilot Math Workshop 7 and 8 and FLEX 6
- As we build WEB, Leadership, and peer tutors, we increase mentoring and empathy on campus
- Seesaw statistics and numbers of parents at back to school night and informational meetings are high
