## Club Staffing & Professional Development

In advance of the Fall 2019 Semester, we hired **39 part-time Program Coordinators** and **10 Full-Time Directors** dedicated to SRCS Clubs. We opened most Clubs fully staffed on the first day of school.

These new staff Members received at least 80 hours of professional development in advance of the Clubs opening. Topics and sessions included: Safety & Supervision, Quality Instructional techniques, Active Recess, Restorative Practices, Academic Support Programs, Social & Emotional Development, Behavior Redirection, Grant Administration, and more.

**We spent \$84,796 onboarding these employees.** This expense is in-kind to our ASES Contract. THANK YOU to the team at Maria Carrillo High School who worked diligently to demonstrate excellent partnership by providing us a space for this training conference.



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## Secure Sign-in & Sign-out Practices

All SRCS utilize an organizational sign-in/out sheet as required by CDE to gather and track the required attendance data.

Each Club day, staff sign-in Members at a designated campus location by placing a check mark in the "In" column on the sign-in sheet. This check mark signifies that Members attendance for that day of Club.

To sign-out, Parents/Guardians (or approved adult) are required to sign-out the Member(s) at one location, initialing in the "Initial Out" box, entering the time out and entering an Early Release Code if the Member leaves prior to 5:50 PM. Members are called to this location from various campus classrooms and then released to the approved guardian. This allows us to accurately track what time the Member left Club and who signed that Member out for the day.

In some cases, with parent & principal permission, Members are allowed to walk home when it is deemed safe and in the Members' best interest. This allows us to serve students with transportation barriers.

## High- Quality Enrichment Programs

Our Enrichment programs are varied and holistic and are actively coordinated with the students' regular day program and are designed in concert with California Content Standards. Enrichment selections are ever-changing with the input and interests of the members, their parents and collaborative partners like teachers.

This year, we are implementing **56 reading/language programs, 32 math programs, 21 Science/STEM programs** (including hands-on MAKER programs), and 17 social science programs, 24 visual & performing arts programs, and over 30 Sports & recreation programs.

New programs this year include: USTA Tennis Lessons, Google CS+, Girls who Code, and Athletics Academy which reinforces math facts for 2nd-4th graders through sports games.



## Supper

Since school started, we've served **24,348 meals** to SRCS Club Members!

We serve fresh food made with real ingredients daily. Meals are always: Designed with Kids in mind, Created by Chefs, Nutritionally Balanced and Made with High-Quality Ingredients. Sample Daily options include:

- chicken salad slider w/ broccoli
- cheese pizza chef kit w/ carrots
- turkey slider, sun seeds, & celery
- popcorn chicken & salad w/ ranch dressing
- cinnamon grahams, string cheese, sun seeds, & side salad kit
- choice of 1% or fat-free milk; fresh fruit available daily.

## Waitlists

While we continue to overserve our grant requirements, the demand for Club services is high. We are operating with high waitlists at each elementary location.

With no direct outreach to students, we have **166 Students** waiting for after-school programming.

We know these numbers would increase if we directly communicated with families.

If further expansion is desired to eliminate these waitlists, we could partner to serve more students.

California Department of Education reimburses \$1,598 per each student served in after-school programs. We'd expand by adding 20 students at a time at designated sites. The cost to do so is \$31,950 per 20 spaces added.
