La Canada Elementary School attends a three day, two night field trip through the Ocean Institute in Dana Point, California. The trip opens as a "Time Capsule" with a visit to Mission San Juan Capistrano with students traveling through history to experience life in the late 1770's as a Juaneno Indian. Upon leaving the mission, all three 4th grade classes travel up to the Lazy W Ranch where students will be spending the remainder of the day creating an Indian shelter, making adobe bricks, mixing masa for tortilla cooking, identifying plants and their medicinal uses, sand painting, candle making, weaving and more. Day two and three envelop students into the five unique ecosystems of the area where they will be involved in scientific investigations, logging information, and exploring these environments. They will hike up a chaparral while identifying plant and animal life, catch critters and identify them in a riparian, and use a dichotomous guide to identify plants in the Oak Woodland. This day ends with a night hike where nocturnal experiments teach the students about adaptations of nighttime creatures. The last day, students pack up in the morning and head to the Ocean Institute in the Dana Point Harbor where they will embark on a trip into the pelagic ecosystem with opportunities to dig through the ocean floor as it is dredged up and identify microorganisms in the ocean water samples. Students discover the intertidal ecosystem with investigations of salinity, water clarity, pH and more in the harbor. This short explanation simply summarizes the students' outdoor learning.
