




- Coordinator of Student Health, Wellness, and Prevention (RN) 1.0 FTE filled
- Credentialed School Nurses (RN)
 - 12.45 FTEs allocated 10.2 FTEs filled
- Licensed Vocational Nurses
 - 6.75 allocated 6.75 FTEs filled
- Health Services Assistants
 - 25.25 allocated 25.25 FTEs filled

- Training and supervision of unlicensed staff
- Delegation and oversight of LVN licensed care
- Compliance with state mandates



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Role of LVNs and Health Services Assistants

LVN – Licensed Vocational Nurse

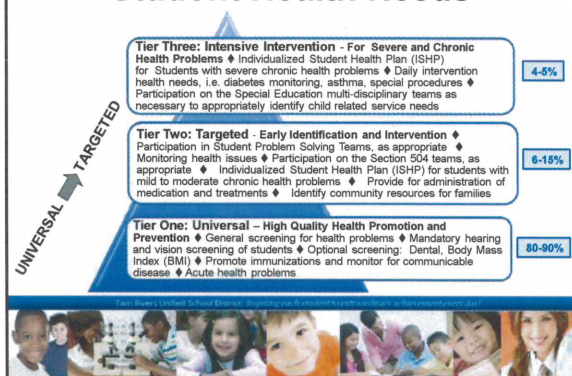
- Provide licensed needs: tracheostomy, diabetic, emergency seizure medications, oxygen administration and gastrostomy feedings

Health Services Assistant

- Provide unlicensed needs: first aid, immunization tracking, medication administration and health office record maintenance.
