



ONLINE LEARNING MODEL

- Students participate online 5 days per week
- Senate Bill 98 defines requirements of distance learning
- Aligned to grade level standards
- Attendance taken daily
- Students will be provided with a device and connectivity



HYBRID MODEL

• Students attend part of the week in-person and the rest of the week online.



Example: Students are divided into cohorts

- 50% Model- Students attend 2 days per week with 3 days of online learning
- 25% Model-Students attend 1 day per week with 4 days of online learning
- Online learning includes the elements outlined in Senate Bill 98
- Health and safety enhancements and considerations in place

TRADITIONAL MODEL WITH SAFETY ENHANCEMENTS

- Students attend five days a week
- Health and safety considerations and precautions in place
 - Frequent sanitization
 - Passive health screenings
- Safety enhancements in accordance with current mandatory protocols
 - Personal Protective Equipment
 - Minimize points of contact
 - Partitions when appropriate (aid in social distancing strategies)
- Courses, classes and extracurriculars may have modifications

SCHOOLS TRANSITION TO TRADITIONAL MODEL

Online and Hybrid Option for Families at the Academy of Innovation

ONLINE MODEL (DISTANCE LEARNING)

- Interaction, instruction, and check-ins via computer
- Aligned to grade-level standards
- Substantially equivalent to in-person instruction
- Daily live interaction with teacher and peers
- Attendance taken daily
- Establish plan to re-engage students that are absent for more than 60% of instruction per week
- Address needs Foster Youth, Homeless, Special Education and English Learners
- Students will be provided with a device and connectivity
- Schedule with synchronous, asynchronous, independent and support times



DEVICES AND CONNECTIVITY

Student Devices:

- Distribute Chromebooks to all students TK-12 beginning August 3rd
 - 10,700 (Elementary)
 - 10,550 (Secondary)
 - 780 (Alternative/Academy of Innovation)
- Distribute Hotspots to students as requested
 - Procuring 3,900 Hotspots (~30% of families)
 - Utilizing both T-Mobile and Verizon for improved coverage
- Teacher Devices:
 - Distribute Laptops to teachers with built-in webcam
 - 350 distributed as of 7/17/2020
 - Provide Remote Tech Support

PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

Training will focus on best practices for online learning

- All HUSD teachers will participate in a virtual conference that will focus on areas needed for a successful online classroom
- Recorded trainings, resources, toolkits and guides are currently available to all teachers through Powerschool to support online learning
- Additional Summer training offerings are being developed to provide more support and preparation time
- Classified classroom support staff training is being developed
- Parent training is being developed

Considerations for Moderate-Severe Supports

- Alternative/modified curriculum
- Provide adaptive technology/equipment in the home
