





Criteria for Enrollment



- * Open to District students only.
- * A student who has failed a core subject must make up the course before enrolling in elective courses.
- * Students entering ninth grade who wish to take Geometry must demonstrate advanced proficiency in Algebra 1 before enrolling.
- * Students entering ninth grade who have not been promoted or have scored far below basic or below basic must enroll in the various site Academic Readiness programs.

Student Survey

Reasons for Taking Summer School Class

- 45% Repeat failed class
- 20% Make room for another class
- 12% Earn units toward graduation
- 8% Repeat class to improve grade
- 6% In IB/AP/Specialized Program
- 6% “I took the class because it seemed interesting to me”
- 3% Improve English language skills




2020 Summer School Budget

Recommendations

- **Develop the 2021 summer school program reflecting the successful experiences of previous years and include students who were affected by the COVID-19 pandemic so they are on-target to fulfill graduation requirements.**
- **Continue offering two 3-week sessions at each comprehensive school site.**
- **Add an additional 2-week session for LVHS/LSHS.**
- **Carefully consider course offerings at each site and consider consolidation of courses when appropriate.**
- **Continue to offer English 1, 2, and 3 for repeat-credit only.**
- **Continue early staffing to ensure timely hiring of qualified teachers.**
- **Continue increased supervision of all instructional programs to enhance quality.**
- **Continue to implement criteria for admission into specific courses (i.e., READ 180, Algebra 1, and Geometry).**
- **Carefully monitor expenditures.**
- **Continue with reduced ESY at 5 weeks, or 20 days, in accordance with Education Code requirements.**
- **Offer the 2-week health course as an online APEX course for all students needing health credit.**

Authorization for 2021 Summer School

- * This concludes the 2020 Summer School Report.
- * It is recommended that the Board of Trustees approve the recommendation for 2021 Summer School starting June 1, 2021:
- * Two three-week sessions Monday - Thursday on each comprehensive campus;
- * 20 day session for Extended School Year (ESY) on the campuses with adequate enrollment;
- * One four-week session for La Vista and La Sierra High Schools and one two-week session;
- * One six-week session for iSierra Online Academy (Independent Study for La Sierra).
