Professional Development in CUSD

Goal: Provide PD that transforms student and adult learning.

Learning in Campbell will model effective teaching and learning practices and be:

- Flexible (facilitated and self-guided instruction both in person and on-line)
- Collaborative in both large and small groups
- On-going, leading to lasting change
- Based on solid educational research

Strategic Focus

IDENTIFIED PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT TOPICS:

- Professional Learning Communities
- Differentiation
- Challenging Student Behaviors
- Curriculum Support to teach the standards
(new instructional materials in English/Lang. Arts, Math, Next Gen. Science Standards, and English Lang. Development Framework)
- Technology Integration
- Assessment

How is PD Delivered?

Mandatory

- Identified PD days on calendar (2-3 per year)
- Identified PLC meetings during the year (5)
- Two-hour meetings at the site level
- PD embedded into staff meetings at the site level

Voluntary

- Per Diem PD day on calendar (1 per year)
- Learning Circles
- Saturday Sessions
- Summer Trainings
- Lunch and Learns
- Embedded through Coaching Support in and out of classroom

Learning Circles

90-120 minute sessions delivered after school with coaching and/or online support. (3-5 sessions)

Topics this year:

- NGSS (Elementary and Middle School)
- ELD/ELA Framework alignment
- Blended learning in Math
- Technology/STEAM integration
- Foundational reading skills
- Vocabulary development to support close reading

Saturday Sessions

- Designated PD days where teachers will be paid their hourly rate to attend
- Identified Professional Development topics covered

Dates:

January 9, 23, 30, Feb. 27, March 26, April 23

ELA Adoption PD

- Materials to teachers for self evaluation by 6/30
- Scheduled grade level collaboration days throughout the summer
- Formal training from publisher: 2 days in August
- Follow up publisher training: 1st PD day of the year
- Site allocated collaboration time
- Coaching and lesson modeling from district ELA coaches

Summer 2016

- Differentiation Institute
- Assessment in Daily Instruction Institute
- August 1-5: iTeach: Instructional Design for 21st Century Learning
- Summer work groups

Academic Year 2016-17

- On-going ELA and Math curriculum support
- Continued focus on our designated topics with Professional Learning Communities (PLC) as the key instructional practice
- Repeated trainings to continue building capacity of teacher leaders
- Increased opportunities for Next Generation Science Standards (NGSS) Training
- Blended learning opportunities with online support

Classified Staff PD

- Partnership with SJSU
 - Project SAIL with 40 attendees
- Applicable Saturday sessions are open to Classified staff
- Annual PD days



Professional Development

Challenges

- Guaranteed time to ensure all teachers/Admin receive the same training
- Ensuring that the PD is truly changing practice

Next Steps

- Strategically repeat trainings offered with a variety of time options
- Provide coaching, follow up sessions and accountability structures

Professional Development

Challenges

- Differentiation of training based on teacher skill set
- Possible adoption of a digital curriculum for middle school

Next Steps

- Build capacity of our staff to create trainer of trainer models, offer leveled options
- Continued communication with CETA, on-going training and work on mind set
