

Articles of Incorporation
Of
Raising the Curtain Foundation
A California Nonprofit Public Benefit Corporation

Article I

The name of this association is Raising the Curtain Foundation.

Article IIA

The corporation is a nonprofit Public Benefit Corporation and is not organized for the private gain of any person. It is organized under the Nonprofit Public Benefit Corporation Law for public and charitable purposes.

Article IIB

The intent of the Raising the Curtain Foundation is to support and enhance the Newhall Family Theater for the Performing Arts located at the Newhall Elementary School. The Foundation will work to provide experiences within the Performance Arts that educate, nurture, and inspire the students and surrounding community.

Raising the Curtain Foundation consists of members joined by mutual consent for the common, nonprofit purposes of raising funds by private donations and/or in-kind work, sponsorship of fundraisers, and promotion of community support and involvement in the school district, and add significant value to the investment of the arts in the public school system.

Article III

Article IV

This corporation is organized and operated exclusively for charitable purposes within the meaning of Internal Revenue Code section 501(c)(3).

No substantial part of the activities of this corporation shall consist of carrying on propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the corporation shall not participate or intervene in any political campaign (including the publishing or distribution of statements) on behalf of any candidate for public office.

Article V

The property of this corporation is irrevocably dedicated to charitable purposes and no part of the net income or assets of this corporation shall ever inure to the benefit of any director, officer or member thereof or to the benefit of any private person. Upon the dissolution or winding up of the corporation, its assets remaining after payment, or provision for payment, of all debts and liabilities of this corporation shall be distributed to a nonprofit fund, foundation or corporation which is organized and operated exclusively for charitable purposes and which has established its tax exempt status under Internal Revenue Code section 501(c)(3).
