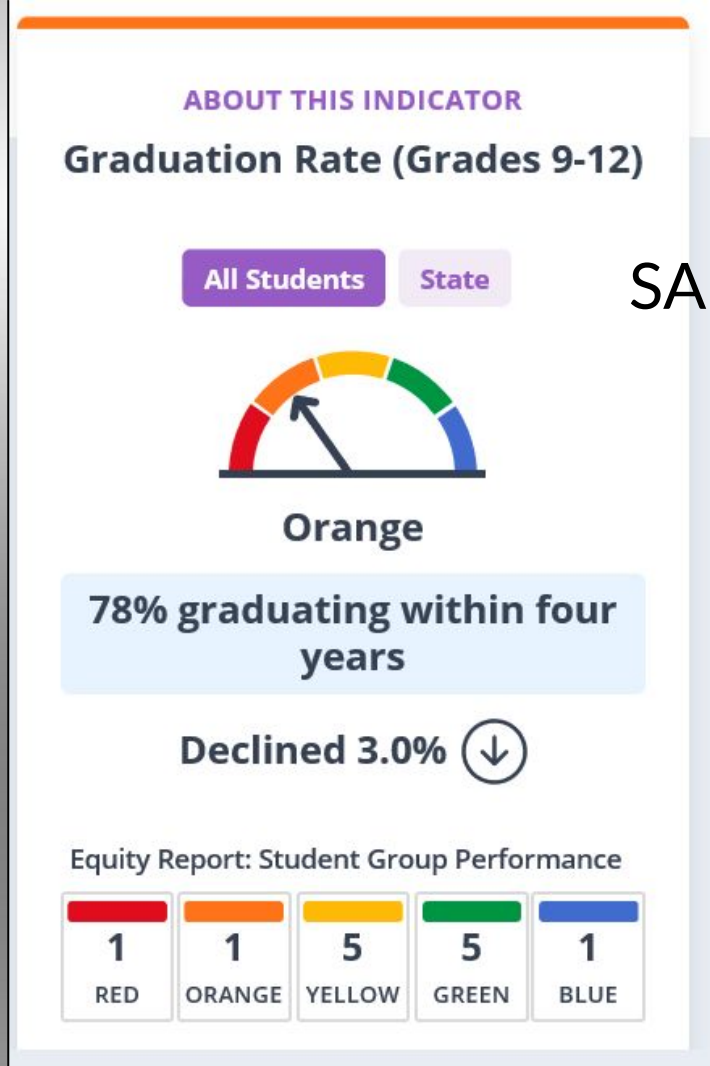

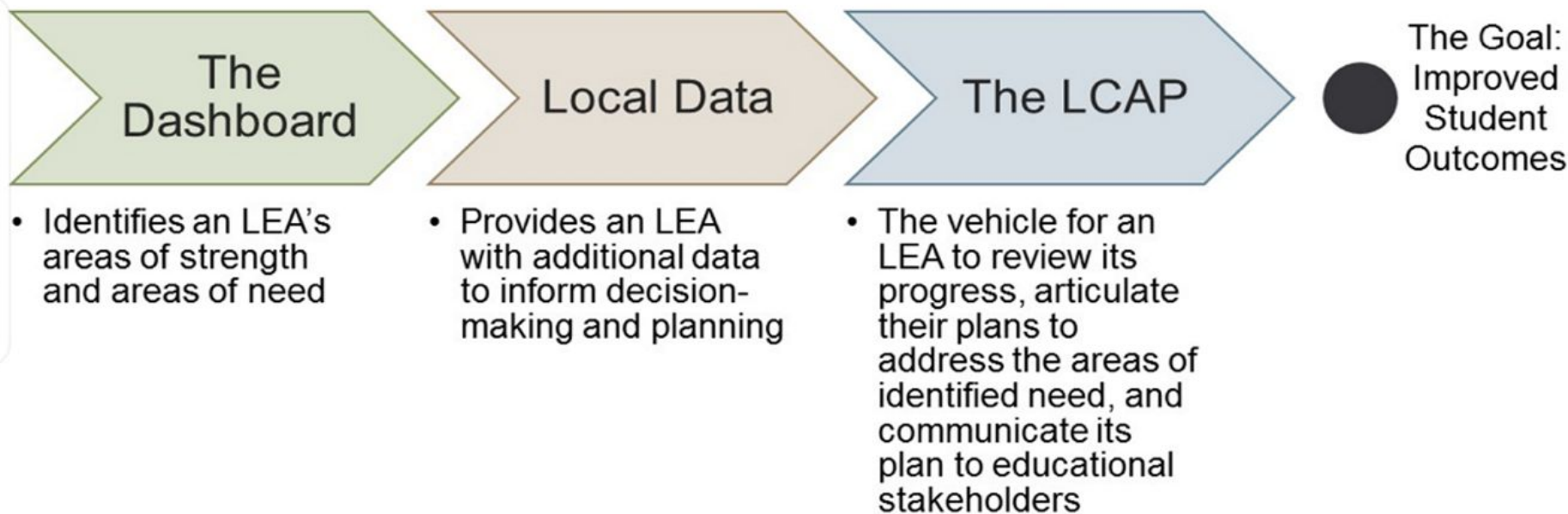

## Priority 6: School Climate

The need for a professional development plan that included offerings for all staff.</li></ul>

Development and implementation of a comprehensive professional development plan that included offerings for all staff</li></ul>
