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PUBLIC SCHOOLS IN ALAMEDA COUNTY TO CLOSE FRIDAY

All public school districts in Alameda County will be closed on Friday, November 16 due to unhealthy air quality conditions throughout the county.

The decision to close county districts was reached collectively on Thursday afternoon by the superintendents of Alameda County's 21 school districts and Regional Occupational Programs.

In making this critical decision, the leaders of Alameda County schools weighed numerous factors, taking into consideration the safety of students and staff and the best interest of individual communities.

"This was not a decision reached lightly as we know that it is important for our students to be in school and learning," said L. Karen Monroe, Alameda County Superintendent of Schools. "The safety of students and staff is paramount and the poor air quality conditions throughout the Bay Area made this a necessary step."

The Alameda County Office of Education is committed to working alongside our school districts as they communicate this decision to their communities.

In the past week we have witnessed devastating effects of the ongoing Northern California wildfires, and our hearts go out to the affected communities. As a result of the wildfires, air quality in Alameda County has tipped into "unhealthy levels", as defined by the Bay Area Air Quality Management District. Districts have been monitoring air quality throughout the week and have been limited outdoor activities in accordance with Alameda County Public Health Department guidelines.

Families should check their school district websites for their school communities' most current communications.

About ACOE

The Alameda County Office of Education (ACOE), under the leadership of County Superintendent of Schools L. Karen Monroe, serves as liaison between the California Department of Education and the 18 Alameda County public school districts that serve more than 200,000 students and 10,000 teachers.
