California School Dashboard: an online tool that shows how districts and schools are performing

December 2018: Release of California Department of Education indicators.

BUSD improvement areas for homeless students:

- **college and career readiness indicator**
- **chronic absenteeism** for homeless students in grades K-8.

Effective Use of Dashboard Data?

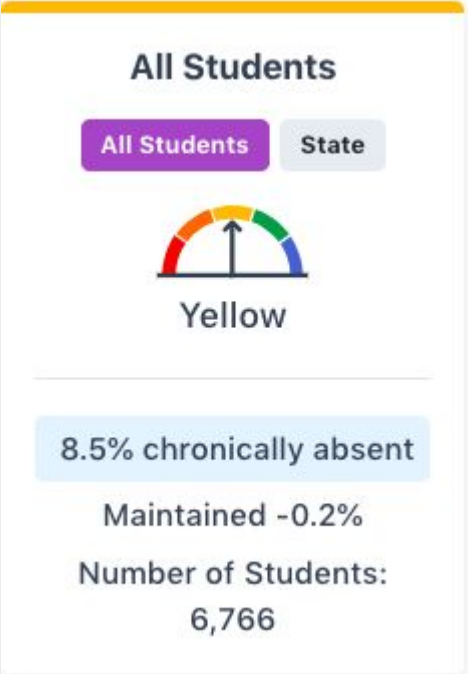
Data based on year to year cohort performance.






Potential:

- Dashboard data used to raise awareness in the near term or make high impact low cost adjustments
- Be used to inform larger and/or more significant changes in systems or service delivery over time as patterns emerge

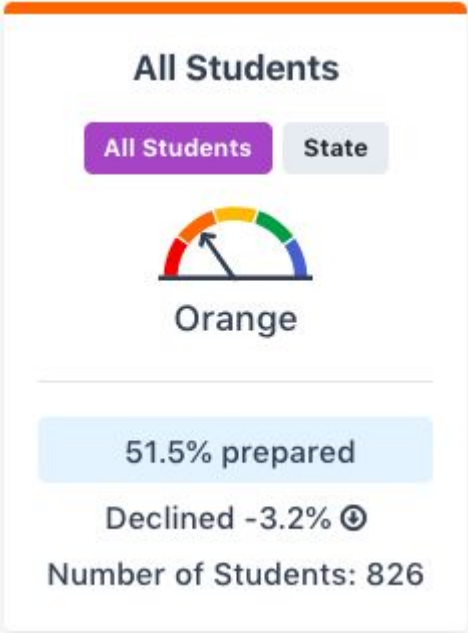

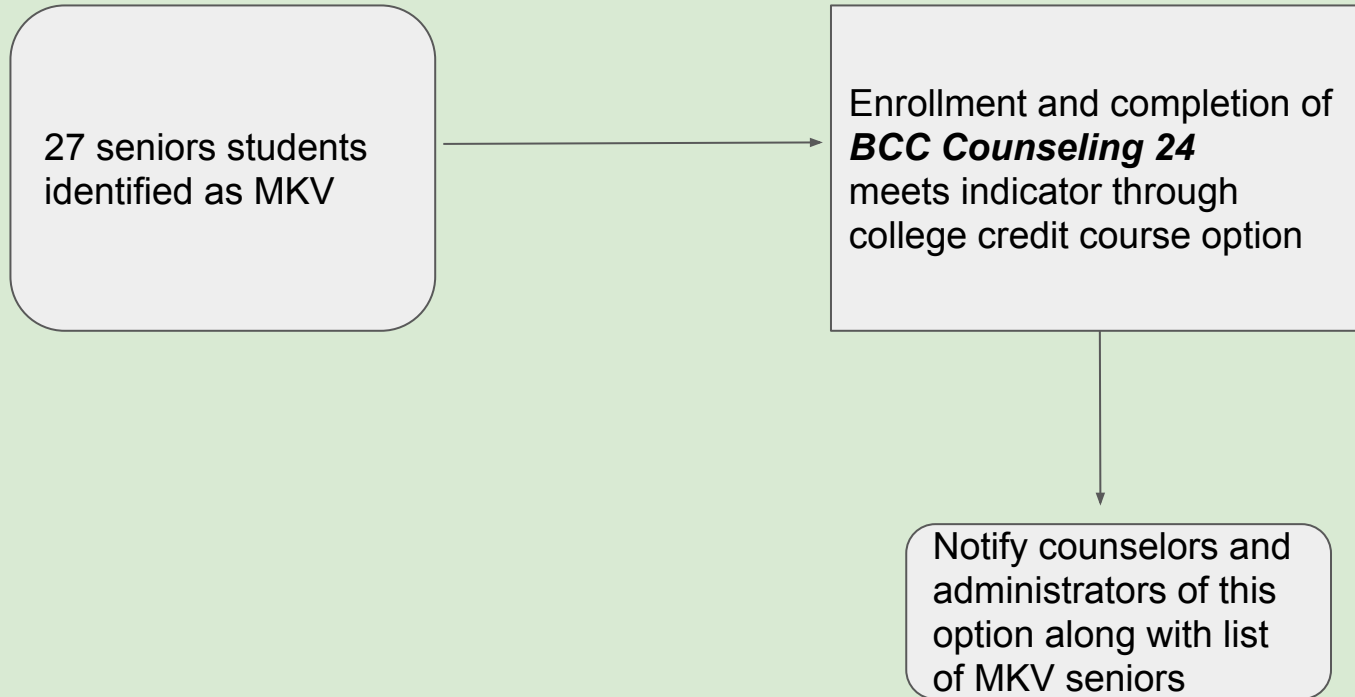
How did Bridge cohort meet preparedness criteria at this rate?

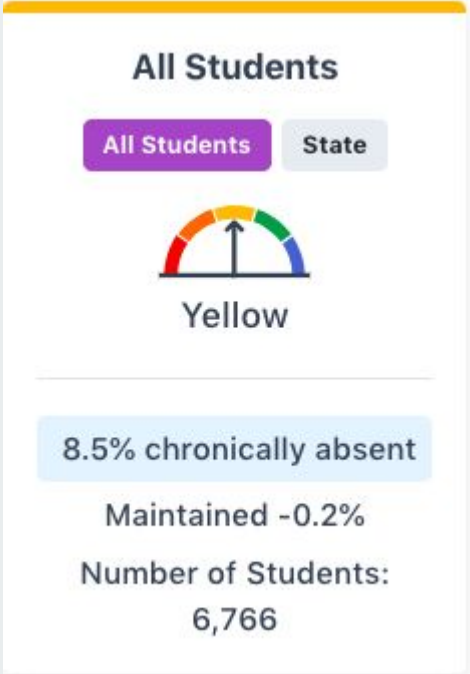

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Current Cohort Analysis


158 K-8 MKV enrolled 30 or more days YTD, 37 are currently chronically absent (23.4%).

Of 37, 5 **will be** chronically absent this year even if they are enrolled the full 180 days; already missed 18 or more days of school.

20 of 37 that are currently chronically absent have 10 or more absences already with more than half the school year to go.

Keys to Improvement

Scenarios for chronic absenteeism for us to get out of differentiated assistance for MKV in attendance.

- **Decline in chronic absenteeism rate by 0.5% - 2.9%**
- **Decline significantly in chronic absenteeism rate by 3.0% or more**
