Themes

- LCFF at target
 - Funding flattens and costs rise
 - Increases are COLA only
- Early Childhood Education Initiative
 - Early access to care and education
 - Support for parents and families
 - Easing financial pressures on parents and families
 - Private pre K, non District programs
- Accountability – Longitudinal Education Data System
- Recognition of STRS/PERS liabilities
- Special Ed additional supports

What's included . . .

- COLA increase of 3.46%
 - LCFF funding
 - Special Education AB602
 - State Pre School Reimbursement
- Offset of STRS rate increases
 - Reduce rate of increase by 1% for next 2 years
 - Savings to District of \$600k in each of these years
 - Lessens amount of increase, not a decrease
- Special Education
 - Proposed supports for pre-K and early elementary students

What's included . . .

- Facilities Funding
 - Sale of Proposition 51 bonds - \$1.5 billion
 - Fund positions at Office of Public School Construction to manage the work flow
- Longitudinal Education Data System
 - Funding for initial stages of data system connecting early childhood, K12, higher Ed and workforce entities
 - “Cradle to Career” data system connecting all of the education segments

Not included . . .

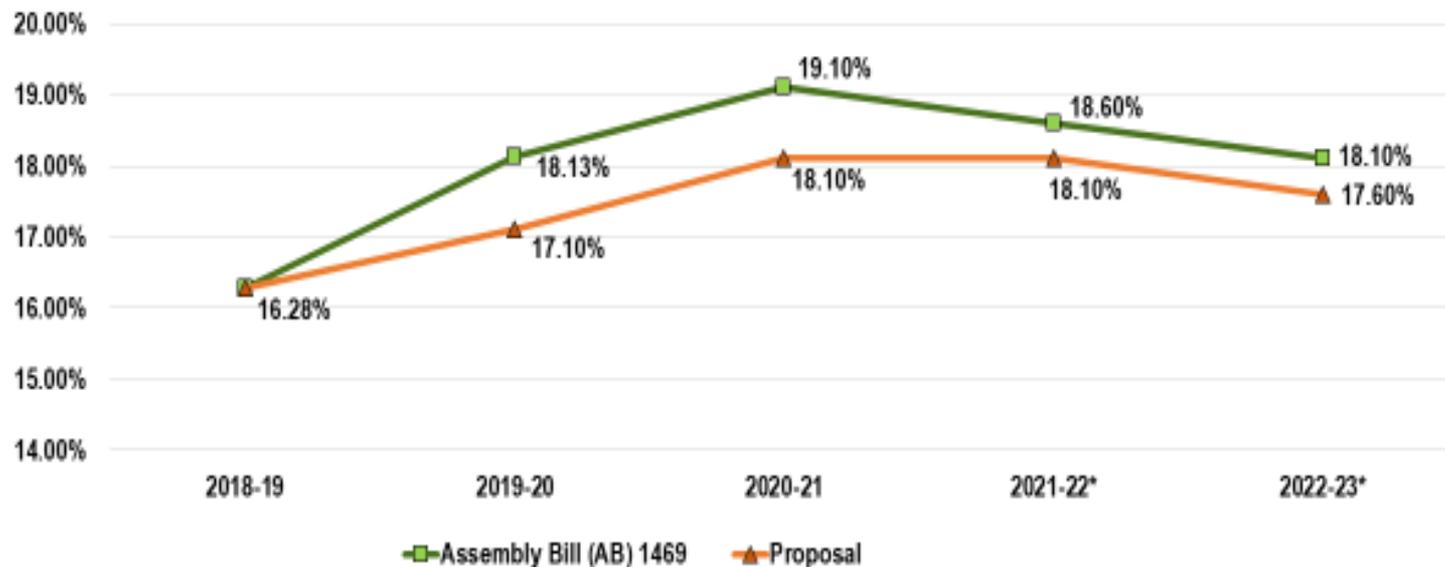
- One-time funds for discretionary grants
 - Not in Governor Newsom's proposed budget

*Beginning in 2021-22, the CalSTRS Board has authority to increase/decrease the employer contribution rate (with some restrictions) to fully fund the unfunded liability by 2046
