As grandmother to five grandsons who have attended or are currently attending California public schools, I have a true passion for all our children and their critical needs in this challenging period for public education in our State. The Delegate Assembly provides a vehicle for my continued advocacy, as well as my continued exposure to the best thinking of the CSBA staff and my fellow delegates who are the leaders in our State. I value what I have learned from CSBA and the information and influence it has helped me bring back into my role on my own Board. My membership will allow me to continue working with my Region 7B colleagues on critical regional issues facing the SF East Bay area.

I am currently finishing my 16th year on the Newark Unified Board. During 2018 I was president of my own NUSD Board as well as the Mission Valley ROP Board. I am currently one of two CSBA representatives to the California Interscholastic Federation (CIF) Federated Council. I have completed the Masters in Governance program, New Board Member Workshop, Brown Act and Ethics Workshops and have attended most CSBA annual conferences and Legislative Action Days. I have co-presented workshops at the two most recent AECs, and was a Golden Bell Award validator this year. I am a member of my local Rotary and Optimist Clubs, and an elected member of the Alameda County Democratic Central Committee.

**What do you see as the biggest challenge facing governing boards and how can CSBA help address it?** (Character count limit: 700)

Without a doubt, the lack of full and fair funding is the biggest challenge facing governing boards. By 2020, our district will be receiving \$3 million less PER YEAR than we did in 2014 due to STRS/PERS increases alone. Our enrollment has decreased by 1,450 students over the past 10 years, a 20% drop. Instead of a small enrollment increase we anticipated this year, we had an unexpected decrease of 140 students, with most apparently leaving the area due to the housing crisis. CSBA can help by continuing to press for more funding and by lobbying for incentives to help recruit and retain teachers in high cost-of-living areas like we are experiencing in the East Bay.
