

Dual Enrollment

2003- Senate Bill 338:

- Provide educational enrichment opportunities for eligible high school students.

2016- Assembly Bill 288:

- Allows community college districts to enter into a College and Career Access Pathways partnership (CCAP) with local school districts with the goal of developing seamless pathways from high school to community college for career technical education or preparation for transfer, improving high school graduation rates, or helping high school pupils achieve college and career readiness.

Students may earn college and high school credits by taking community college classes during their high school day.

Students participating under this agreement may enroll in up to a maximum of 15 units per term.

Quick view at the MOU

- Student fees: All fees associated with CCAP courses will be waived.
- Faculty: PCC will assign the faculty. LCUSD staff/faculty that meet minimum qualifications to teach a CCC class, may apply to become part-time faculty and may be considered for the assignment. LCUSD will work with bargaining groups to ensure understanding of the opportunity to teach PACCD classes.
- Students: Any student from the LCUSD may have access to the classes at the recommendation of the school Principal or their designee. PCC will work with the district and schools to provide information on pre-requisite and co-requisites for courses prior to the courses being offered.
- Course Materials: LCUSD will take on all costs associated with instructional materials (i.e. textbooks, equipment, and supplies and other instructional materials). PCC will explore ways to minimize the cost of textbooks and instructional materials (i.e. Open Educational Resources).
- Course Selection: PCC will work with the high school and the district Liaison to identify classes and how they will be offered to meet the needs of the community and that follow the requirements outlined in the CCAP requirements.
 - **CTE, Transfer, improving high school graduation rates, or college and career readiness.**
 - PACCD and LCUSD will ensure that no PACCD or LCUSD faculty is displaced as a result of this agreement.

Course Selection

AB 288-Requirements

- **CTE, Transfer, improving high school graduation rates, or college and career readiness**
- If Non-CCAP
 - Open to the community
 - Offered after school
 - Credit can be used at LCUSD or PCC or both
- If CCAP
 - Restricted to only LCUSD students
 - Offered during the students school day
 - Requires
 - Credit for both PCC and LCUSD
